(Isaiah 6:3)

God is holy. His name is _____

For thus says the High and Lofty One
Who inhabits eternity, whose name *is* Holy:
“I dwell in the high and holy *place*,
With him *who* has a contrite and humble spirit,
To revive the spirit of the humble,
And to revive the heart of the contrite ones.”
(Isaiah 57:15)

As His name, so is He.

Let's look at the following verses:



Speak to all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them “You shall be **holy**, for I the LORD your God *am* **holy**.” (Leviticus 19:2)

But as He who called you *is* **holy**, you also be **holy** in all *your* conduct, because it is written, “Be **holy**, for I am **holy**.” (1 Peter 1:15-16)

“Are You not from everlasting, O LORD my God, my **Holy** One? We shall not die. O LORD, You have appointed them for judgment; O Rock, You have marked them for correction. *You are* of purer eyes than to behold evil, And cannot look on wickedness. Why do You look on those who deal treacherously, *And* hold Your tongue when the wicked devours *A person* more righteous than he?” (Habakkuk 1:12-13)

The four living creatures, each having six wings, were full of eyes around and within. And they do not rest day or night, saying: “**Holy, holy, holy**, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!” (Revelations 4:8)

What must be our response?



God being holy doesn't mean God cannot see what is going on. He sees every sin that is ever committed. That means He cannot look on sin with any measure of approval. He cannot condone iniquity. He cannot countenance anything that is wrong.

Let us now consider the holiness of God-Man, Jesus Christ.....



For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. (2 Corinthians 5:21)

Who committed no sin, Nor was deceit found in His mouth.
(1 Peter 2:22)

And you know that He was manifested to take away our sins,
and in Him there is no sin. (1 John 3:5)

Pilate's confession:

“I find no fault in Him at all.” (John 18:38)

“Behold, I am bringing Him out to you, that you may know that I find no fault in Him.” (John 19:4)

“You take Him and crucify *Him*, for I find no fault in Him.” (John 19:6)

At Calvary:



We see one of the greatest displays of God's holiness. God must punish sin. His holiness forbids Him to condone it. The sacrificial victim in His own Son who is there for our sins. God cannot make an exception. His wrath fell on the Lord Jesus.

Points to Remember:

God's holiness never cost Him more dearly than at Calvary! We can be eternally grateful that He was willing to pay the price!
