



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
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Revived Roman Empire



Revived Roman Empire – Similarities to the Roman Republic

- ✓ Branches of Government Separates Power
 - US has the executive, legislative, and judicial branches

✓ Representatives Make Key Decisions

- Legislative bodies (e.g., Congress Representatives & Senate)
- Made up of officials elected by the people

✓ Rule of Law

• Laws apply equally to all citizens regardless of status

✓ Architectural Style

- Important government buildings and sports stadiums
- Statue of Liberty is similar to ancient Roman goddesses

✓ Romance Languages and Latin

- French, Spanish, Italian, Portuguese, and Romanian
- English alphabet based on the Latin alphabet

Governments over time have become more fragmented and today's world appears to resemble the revived Roman empire - statue's feet and beast's horns. The statue and beast are both destroyed by Jesus - stone that struck the statue's feet & one like a son of man given dominion by the Ancient of Days.

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God's Sovereignty

God is above all powers through all time, so none of His purposes & plans can be thwarted.

9 I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me.

10 I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say, 'My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please.' *Isaiah 46:9-10*

16 For in Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through Him and for Him.

17 He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. *Colossians 1:16-17*

God's Sovereignty Over People and Events

Chapters 1, 3, 6 | King's Service, Fiery Furnace, Lion's Den

Daniel and His Friends in the King's Service

God, though He is sovereign over all, accomplishes His purposes and plans through the choices that people make, whether they are good or bad.

Daniel obeyed God by not defiling himself with the king's portions | 1:8-9

- ✤ He did not want to defile himself by eating food that was unclean, based on the Law
- Food and drink sacrificed to idols could also be seen as honoring the idols

God works on behalf of Daniel and his three friends | 1:17

- God granted Daniel favor and compassion with the commander of the officials
- God allowed the 10-day test to take place, providing proof to the commander
- God gave Daniel and his friends wisdom and intelligence abundantly
- God gave Daniel the ability understand visions and dreams

Daniel's Friends in the Fiery Furnace

Nebuchadnezzar sought worship and reverence like a god | 3:1, 4-6

- He made an image/statue, likely of himself
- He demanded that everyone worship the image when the music played or be cast into a furnace

Certain Chaldeans were jealous of Daniel's three friends | 3:8-13

- They told the king that Daniel's three friends did not worship the image when the music was played
- They reminded the king what the punishment was for not worshiping the image

Daniel's three friends trust in God, regardless of the outcome | 3:16-18

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego honor God and demonstrate unwavering trust

God delivered the three men and caused them to prosper | 3:25-26, 28-30

- Deliverance, protection, and blessings helped the Jews prosper
- Nebuchadnezzar even calls God the Most High God

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Daniel in the Lion's Den

The leaders of the Medes and Persians were jealous of Daniel | 6:3-4, 7

- They were jealous that the king was going to appoint Daniel over the entire kingdom
- They tricked the king into signing an irrevocable decree that would kill Daniel

Daniel continued to faithfully worship God, despite the decree | 6:10

He continued to pray and give thanks to God three times a day

Neither the leaders or the king can thwart God's plans | 6:11-16

- The leaders reminded the king what the punishment was for not worshiping the image
- The king is unable to override the laws of the Medes and Persians, but showed faith in God


God delivered Daniel from the lions in the den | 6:20-23, 26-28

- Deliverance, protection, and blessings helped the Jews prosper
- ✤ The king, like Nebuchadnezzar, calls God the Most High God

2:19-23

Daniel's Vision of the Four Beasts

7:13-27

BABYLON

- Head of fine **gold** Nebuchadnezzar
- God gave him the greatest kingdom
- God caused him to rule over all



- Like a **lion** with wings of an eagle
- Wings were plucked and stood on two feet
- A human mind was given to it

MEDO-PERSIA

- Breast and arms of silver
- Inferior to Babylon

GREECE

- Belly and thighs of bronze
- Inferior to Medo-Persia
- Ruled over all the earth (influence)

ROME / REVIVED ROME

- Legs of iron and feet of iron & clay
- Powerful but divided in the feet & toes
- Stone not cut by hands strikes the feet



- Resembled a bear
- Raised up on one side (Persia was greater)
- Three ribs were in its mouth between its teeth
- It was told to, "arise, and devour much meat"



- Like a leopard with four wings and four heads
- Dominion was given to it
- Points to Alexander's 4 generals



- Dreadful and terrifying and different
- It had large iron teeth, and ten horns
- A little and boastful horn supplanted 3 others
- Little horn had eyes and a boastful mouth
- The Son of Man destroys the beast

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Medo-Persia Conquered by Greece

Leaders and nations will continue to be proud and magnify themselves, defying God's sovereignty, until the final antichrist gives way to God's eternal kingdom.

The Medes and Persians are pictured as a ram with two horns | 8:1-4

- One horn was longer than the other, showing how Persia was the dominant of the two
- They did as they pleased and magnified themselves

Greece is pictured as a goat with one horn then four horns | 8:8-12, 21-26

- The first conspicuous horn was Alexander the Great, who magnified himself exceedingly
- The four conspicuous horns that replaced the first horn are Alexander's four generals
- ✤ Out of one of the four horns came a small horn that became exceedingly great
- The small horn is Antiochus Epiphanes, an antichrist that mocked God and magnified himself
